# 1. National Overview



The overall flood and landslide situation shows continued improvement in displacement figures, alongside slight increases in fatalities and housing damage, reflecting delayed reporting from severely affected areas.

According to the Disaster Management Centre update of 14 December 2025 at 0600 hrs:

- **391,401 families affected**
- **1,364,481 persons affected**
- **643 deaths**
- **184 missing persons**
- **6,164 fully damaged houses**
- **112,110 partially damaged houses**

## Displacement & Shelter

- **796 safety centres active, sheltering:**
  - **23,041 families**
  - **72,911 persons**

# 2. Worst-Affected Districts



## Highest Affected Populations

- Colombo: 330,464 persons
- Puttalam: 262,710 persons
- Kurunegala: 93,269 persons
- Trincomalee: 90,475 persons
- Badulla: 85,291 persons

## Highest Fatalities

- Kandy: 236 deaths
- Badulla: 88 deaths
- Nuwara Eliya: 89 deaths
- Kurunegala: 61 deaths
- Kegalle: 32 deaths



### Fully Damaged Houses

- **Kandy: 2,013**
- **Nuwara Eliya: 767**
- **Puttalam: 632**
- **Kurunegala: 596**
- **Badulla: 587**

### Partially Damaged Houses

- **Puttalam: 21,137**
- **Kandy: 14,562**

# 3. Displacement & Safety Centres

Districts with the largest remaining displaced populations:

- **Kandy:**
  - 252 centres
  - 5,927 families (19,941 persons)
- **Nuwara Eliya:**
  - 203 centres
  - 6,305 families (19,537 persons)
- **Badulla:**
  - 155 centres
  - 6,026 families (19,409 persons)
- **Kegalle:**
  - 92 centres
  - 2,550 families (7,296 persons)



# 4. Sectoral Situation

## Food & Essential Needs

- Declining centre populations reduce meal demand, but returnee support remains critical.

## Health & Nutrition

- Continued risks of water-borne disease, malnutrition, and protection concerns, particularly in plantation and estate areas.

## Shelter & Protection

- Increase in fully damaged houses highlights growing need for transitional shelter and repair assistance.

Reduced centre numbers mask long-term displacement risks for households unable to rebuild.

# 6. Key Challenges

- Rising confirmed fatalities
- Increasing verified housing damage
- Limited land stability for returns in hill country
- Transitioning from relief to early recovery



# 7. Conclusion

As of **14 December 2025 - 0600 hrs**, floods and landslides continue to affect **over 1.36 million people**. Although displacement continues to decline, **shelter, protection, and early recovery needs remain substantial**, particularly in districts with high fatalities and severe housing damage.
